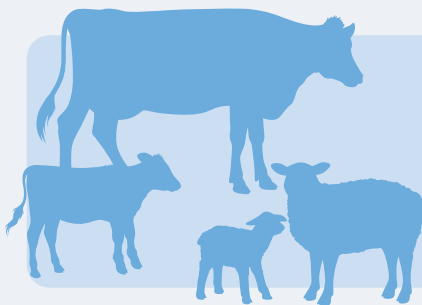

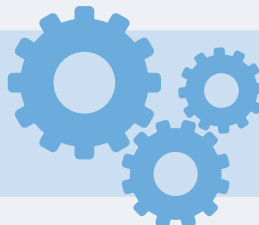
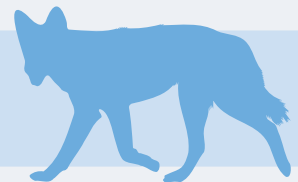


Productivity
